PRAYING THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

The rosary is one of the most beloved devotions in the Catholic faith because it draws us into the heart of the Gospel through the repetition of familiar prayer and the contemplation of Christ's life.


To pray the rosary is to sit with Mary and meditate on the face of her Son. The Joyful Mysteries invite us to rejoice in the incarnation; the Sorrowful Mysteries help us to unite with Christ's passion; the Glorious Mysteries fill us with the hope of the resurrection; and the Luminous Mysteries open our eyes to the public ministry of Jesus, the light of the world. Each bead becomes like a step closer to Jesus, walking hand-in-hand with Mary, who always points us to her Son.

The repetition of the Hail Mary is not meant to be mindless, but rather rhythmic—like the steady breathing of the soul. It helps quiet the distractions of the world so that the heart can focus on God. In this way, the rosary is both a spoken prayer and a prayer of the heart.




The rosary is also powerful in its simplicity. Saints and popes have called it a "spiritual weapon" against evil, a source of peace in families, and a channel of grace for the world. When we pray it faithfully, we join in a long chain of prayer that stretches across the Church and through time, uniting us with countless other believers.

To pray the rosary is to be wrapped in Mary's mantle, to learn from her how to say "yes" to God in all things, and to grow in love for Christ. It is a daily pathway of grace that strengthens our soul, deepens our faith, and draws us ever closer to the eternal embrace of the Father.

The Power of Evangelizing Inspiration







There is an effort underway to bring a Catholic High School to St. Croix County. While we have four excellent Catholic grade schools, they only provide education through 8th grade. Families currently must send students to public schools or travel to the Twin Cities, Chippewa Falls, or Eau Claire for Catholic high school. Our Diocese of Superior has none.

A volunteer group representing local parishes, with the support of our Bishop, is studying the possibility of establishing a Catholic High School here. The representatives from our ICSP Catholic Communities are Dr. Steve Harrold and Maria Helgerson. The group have already surveyed families in our Catholic schools and now seek broader community input.

GROW IN OUR FAITH & LEAD OTHERS TO CHRIST

EVANGELIZED BY THE SUN IN LAKE OF THE OZARKS

In a cabin on the bank of Lake Ozark in Missouri, a vacation morning allowed for a slow start to the day with kiddos snuggled on the couch watching cartoons and the baby still asleep in her crib. As my husband sipped his coffee inside, I stepped outside to a perfect sunny and 75 degree morning to take in the view and spend a restful minute with God.

As I sat down, I couldn't focus on the devotional I had in hand with the perfect scene in front of me. So, instead, I leaned back in the chair, closed my eyes and let the sun warm my face. Opening my eyes, I looked up, and noticed the sun that had felt so strong, was shining through the tiniest break in the leaves of the trees overhead. It was as if the sun had pulled the leaves just far enough apart to shine directly on me. I closed my eyes again thanking God with a smile and thinking - how can the sun always find me? In that moment God reminded me - just like the sun found me through that tiny crack - Jesus wants to do the same.

Like the hot Missouri sun, His Son, waits for even the tiniest opening of my heart to pour himself into and fill me with His warmth, love and peace. How good is our God!

But there is more to this moment - I was not alone in it - while I was enjoying the sun that morning, the same sun was also blessing more people in more places than I could ever name. Just like the one sun in the sky brings everyone light, God's one Son, Jesus, wants to do the same.

It doesn't matter where we are in life or what we have or have not done, it is the same Son that desires to enter each of our hearts when we slow down enough to step outside, take a breath and open ourselves to Him. This transformation of heart is meant to be a shared experience for believers. Something we have in common. A communion of our hearts in the same Son; making us "one" in His peace, "one" in His love; "one" in Christ.

This is the unity I have found in the In Christ Women's Groups. A unity of hearts, individually and collectively, striving to open to the light of God's great and intimate love; striving to carry out His will. The care and concern, the encouragement and prayer we share together is sacred and true. The journey looks different for each of us, and none of us are perfect, but we are all illuminated by the same Son.

So perhaps, in order to evangelize, we must first be evangelized by the sun; God's Son - Jesus Christ - in little moments of sacred silence shared only with Him. It is with Jesus' daily "recharge" that the light inside us grows brighter. The more time we spend with Him - the brighter His light in us will shine - until it can no longer be contained and it must be shared. Then, together, our hearts as "one" (Jesus' - yours - mine), gently and surely pour out our love, into even the smallest cracks of the open doors of any heart we encounter - the hearts of our spouses, the hearts of our children, and most importantly as a return of love to the heart of our Father.

Where is God Calling You?

Your time and talent are what keeps our ministries alive. Joining a ministry is one of the best ways to form connections and friendships within our parish community. To find out more, please check out our Ministry Booklet at icspcatholic.com/ministries/ or reach out to our ICSP Business Office and we will be happy to connect you to the right resources.

Here is a highlight of just some of the ministries that are offered:

Sewing Ministry

This ministry involves several sewing projects which are prayer blankets, baptismal blankets, baptismal gowns, and menstrual pads for women. Prayer blankets and baptismal blankets are lap size blankets that are given to people who are either having a child baptized, those who are sick, or going through extremely difficult times in their life. The group meets every month in Corrigan Hall to assemble the products. On the first Friday of the month, the products are blessed at Mass. The baptismal gowns are put together a couple of times out of the year and are for the newly Baptized. The menstrual pads are made for women throughout the world who lack access to menstrual products. This group meets when there is a need. The only qualifications needed to take part in any of them are helpful hands, a small pair of scissors, and a caring heart.

Sunday Social

Sunday Social is a time to have camaraderie, meet new and greet fellow Catholics after Sunday 9:00 am Mass in Corrigan Hall. Each volunteer is a member of a team that sets up and serves refreshments. Each team is usually scheduled every other month.

Slides/Projector

This volunteer works at a laptop operating a PowerPoint slide deck which is projected at the front of the church during Mass at Immaculate Conception. Not much computer knowledge is needed, as the PowerPoint is ready, it's simply clicking along through the slides in time to the Mass. You would learn by shadowing a volunteer on using the equipment.

Audio/Video

During our Sunday 9:00 am Mass our service is recorded. This recording gets sent to Channel 6 cable and is posted to our YouTube and Facebook accounts. There is also a need sometimes for special events we want recorded or funerals. The person volunteering would be provided ample training. It is a wonderful opportunity for young adults considering a career in filming. Along with mentoring with skilled volunteers, you would also have access to training videos to help you learn.

Prayer Line

Sometimes life feels overwhelming. The Prayer Line is a community that lifts each other up through prayer. It's a place where you can both ask for prayer and pray for others. If you're facing a struggle, add your name to the list. Our intercessors will lift you up in prayer, bringing you comfort and peace. If you feel called to pray, become an intercessor. We'll send you a list of requests, and you commit to praying for them. It's a powerful way to serve others through collective prayer.
