REFLECTIONS

A FRESH START

January opens the year with three luminous feasts that reveal the heart of our faith: Mary, Mother of God; the Most Holy Name of Jesus; and the Baptism of the Lord. Together, they form a single arc of revelation—God enters our humanity, is named among us, and then steps into the waters that will redeem the world.

On January 1, the Church proclaims Mary *Theotokos*, the God-bearer. In her, we see the first act of discipleship: receiving Christ and giving Him to the world. Mary teaches us that the new year is not primarily about resolutions, but about reception—welcoming God's grace and allowing it to take flesh in our lives. As Mother of God and Mother of the Church, she stands at the threshold of the year, inviting us to begin again under her maternal care, trusting that she who carried the Word made flesh will help us carry His presence into every corner of our lives.

Only days later, the Church honors the Holy Name of Jesus, the name first spoken over Mary's Child with tenderness and awe. "Jesus"—*Yeshua*—means "God saves." The name itself is a proclamation of His mission and identity. In a world saturated with competing voices and false promises, the Holy Name becomes our anchor and our prayer. To whisper His name is to invoke mercy, to confess our hope, and to place ourselves again under the saving power of the One who came not to condemn, but to heal. The Holy Name reminds us that salvation is not an abstraction; it is a person who knows us, walks with us, and calls us His own.



Finally, as the Christmas season draws toward its close, we behold Christ at the Jordan in the Baptism of the Lord. He who is sinless steps into the waters not to be cleansed, but to sanctify. He descends into the depths of human brokenness so that we might be raised with Him to new life. The heavens are opened, the Father's voice declares Him the beloved Son, and the Spirit descends—here begins the public mission that His holy name foretold. For us, this feast becomes a renewal of our own baptismal identity: beloved, chosen, and sent. In these waters, we discover who we are and whose we are.

In Mary, we meet the humility of God who chooses a human mother.

In the Holy Name, we discover the mission of God who saves.

In the Baptism of the Lord, we encounter the compassion of God who stands with sinners and leads them home.

Together, these January feasts remind us that Catholic life begins and continues in relationship—with Mary who guides, with Jesus who saves, and with the Trinity who claims us as beloved. As the year unfolds, may we live under Mary's mantle, trust in the Holy Name of Jesus, and walk each day in the dignity of our baptism. May these mysteries shape our hearts, steady our steps, and open us to the grace that God always desires to pour out anew.

ENHANCING OUR SAFETY: SECURITY UPGRADES FOR OUR ICSP CATHOLIC COMMUNITIES and ST. MARY SCHOOL

The safety and security of our parishioners, students, staff, and visitors remain a top priority for Immaculate Conception, St. Patrick and St. Mary School. We are excited to announce a significant and comprehensive security upgrade project across all three of these locations. This investment reflects our commitment to providing a safe and secure environment where our faith can flourish and our children can learn without undue worry.

These upgrades are based on best practices and involve state-of-the-art technology to enhance our ability to monitor, secure, and respond to various situations. This project will take place January through the end of February.

ENHANCEMENTS AT IMMACULATE CONCEPTION AND ST. PATRICK



Our church buildings are places of worship and community, and we are implementing changes to ensure they remain safe havens for everyone who walks through our doors.

- Advanced and Additional Camera Systems:** We will be installing new, high-resolution camera systems in key areas both inside and outside the buildings. These cameras offer advanced features such as clearer images, better low-light performance, and wider coverage to help us monitor our properties 24/7.

- Secure Access Control (Door FOB Access):** To better manage access to our church facilities during non-liturgical hours, we are installing FOB access panels on select exterior doors. This system will allow authorized staff and ministry leaders easy access while limiting general entry, adding a crucial layer of security.

- Panic and Lockdown Features:** We are integrating discreet panic and lockdown features into our security infrastructure. These systems are designed to allow personnel to quickly and silently alert authorities and secure the building in the event of an emergency. Comprehensive training will be provided to all church staff on the proper use of these features.

UPGRADES FOR ST. MARY SCHOOL

The safety of our students is paramount. The upgrades at St. Mary School are designed to create the most secure learning environment possible.



- Advanced and Additional Camera Systems:** Similar to the churches, St. Mary School will receive a substantial upgrade to its camera network, focusing on enhanced coverage in hallways, entry/exit points, and playgrounds.

- Comprehensive Door FOB Access Control:** All primary school access points will be outfitted with FOB access panels. This allows us to strictly control who enters the building and when, adding accountability and security throughout the school day. Visitors will continue to follow established sign-in procedures.

- Integrated Lockdown System:** We are implementing a modern, streamlined lockdown system that can be activated instantly throughout the school. This system is designed to provide clear, immediate instructions to staff and students and notify emergency services as required, significantly reducing response time in critical situations.

WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT


The installation of this new equipment is scheduled to begin in the coming weeks and will be coordinated to minimize disruption to church services and school activities.

We understand that conversations about security can be serious, but we view these upgrades as a proactive step born out of love and care for our entire community. These measures are designed to be an effective deterrent and a reliable resource in an emergency, ensuring that Immaculate Conception, St. Patrick and St. Mary School remain welcoming and safe places of faith and education.



EVANGELIZATION:

GROW IN OUR FAITH & LEAD OTHERS TO CHRIST



Evangelization isn't just for missionaries in far-off lands; it begins in the quiet moments of our daily lives. Here are five practical ways to live out your faith and share the light of Christ within your own family and community.

1. Pray Every Day: Build a life of intimacy with the Lord. Read God's Word every day to be transformed by the renewal of your mind, seeing the world as God does and learning to love as He loves.

- **Make Mass a Priority:** Wherever you are, attend Sunday or Saturday evening Mass—even while traveling, visiting family, or attending sports tournaments.
- **Daily Prayer Time:** Set aside time each day to talk to God as a friend. Reflect on Scripture or listen to a Catholic podcast; a few intentional moments can transform your day. If you have children, let them see you pray and invite them to join you in a simple prayer.
- **The Rosary:** Pray the Rosary for someone in need, or invite them to pray it with you.
- **Mealtime Prayer:** Whether at home with guests or out at a restaurant, to be a witness for your gratitude to God.

2. Grow in Your Faith: Commit to learning more about God's desires and His love for us.

- **Small Groups:** Start or join a small faith group to gather for prayer, scripture study, or spiritual conversation in a format that fits your life.
- **Discover Your Gifts:** Take a Charism or Spiritual Gifts Inventory to discover how the Holy Spirit is uniquely working in you.
- **Make a Pilgrimage:** We are blessed with several shrines in Wisconsin. Plan to attend the pilgrimage Father John organizes every two years.
- **Daily Reflection:** Ask yourself, "*Where did I see God today?*" Reflect on those moments and share them with your family.

3. Invest in Christian Friendship: We cannot fulfill our mission alone. Meet with peers regularly to pray and share your hearts—your fears, struggles, and joys.

- **Attend Parish Events Together:** Invite a friend to join you for Mass, Adoration, Stations of the Cross, the Christmas Fair, or formation classes.
- **Talk About Your Faith:** Share your journey with those closest to you—your spouse, children, friends, or godchildren.
- **Go Deeper:** Ask a friend, "How are you and Jesus doing?" to start a more meaningful conversation.

4. Invest in Your Spheres of Influence: The places you naturally spend your time are your primary fields for evangelization. Are you willing to let the Holy Spirit work through you there?

- **Hospitality:** Greet someone at Mass you don't know; a smile and kind words go a long way.
- **Works of Mercy:** Live out your faith by donating to local food shelves, serving at soup kitchens, or visiting the sick or incarcerated.
- **Intentional Kindness:** Practice radical kindness, especially toward your own family. Remember, evangelization starts at home.

5. Respond When Someone Opens Up: When someone shares a struggle or a joy, offer to pray for them. If you are comfortable, offer to pray with them right then and there. Share your personal testimony if it helps, and if they are open to it, invite them to a specific ministry or parish event.




REIGNITE MEN'S GROUP




KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS

A REFLECTION ON 33 DAYS TO EUCHARISTIC GLORY & HOW TO KEEP IT ALIVE WITHIN US

The 33 Days of Eucharistic Glory invited us to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's Real Presence—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—hidden in the humble form of bread and wine. These days were a spiritual pilgrimage, mirroring the 33 years Jesus walked among us. Each day was an invitation to walk with Him in the Eucharist, to rediscover the love that beats at the heart of the Church.

In these weeks of devotion, we learned again that the Eucharist is not a symbol or a memory, but the living Christ, given for us. He remains with us to strengthen our weakness, heal our wounds, and unite us to Himself. As we gaze upon Him in adoration

or receive Him at Mass, we realize that the same Jesus who once calmed storms, forgave sinners, and broke bread with His disciples now dwells with us in silence and glory. The 33 days are a reminder that the Eucharist is not only the summit of our faith but the daily heartbeat of our Catholic life.

When the 33 days came to an end, the invitation of the Eucharist does not. To keep this fire burning within us, we can:

- Stay close to daily or weekly Mass. Returning to the altar often keeps our hearts rooted in gratitude and communion.
- Build a habit of Eucharistic Adoration. Even a few minutes before the tabernacle or monstrance deepens intimacy with Christ.
- Make spiritual communions. When we cannot receive Jesus sacramentally, we can invite Him spiritually into our hearts.
- Read Scripture—especially John 6 and the Emmaus story (Luke 24). These passages rekindle our wonder at the Eucharistic mystery.
- Live a Eucharistic life. Offer your day, forgive generously, serve others—become what you receive.
- Return often to acts of gratitude. Thank Jesus specifically for moments in which His Eucharistic love strengthened or guided you.

The 33 days are not an end but a beginning—an awakening. May the Eucharistic Lord continue to draw us into His heart, transform us in His love, and send us into the world as living tabernacles of His glory.


