PILGRIMS OF HOPE

2025 is a Jubilee Year, themed "Pilgrims of Hope." But what does that truly signify? Let's explore.

We're all familiar with the biblical significance of the number 7: the seven days of the week, Jesus' instruction to forgive "77 times," Elijah's seven dips in the Jordan, the seven parables, woes, churches, gifts of the Spirit, core virtues, and seals. This resonates with the ancient practice of the "Sabbath Year," observed every seventh year. During this year, there was no planting or harvesting, debts were forgiven, land reverted to its original owners, and work ceased. This is an invitation to embark on a deeply personal spiritual journey, as sacred and sacrificial as you choose. It's an opportunity for surrender, for authentic encounters, and for deepening your relationship with Christ. What a beautiful way to honor your faith and love for Jesus. We are all called to embody a missionary spirit, uphold Catholic social teaching, and, most importantly, be present to others. What have you got to lose?"

We understand the importance of convenient and secure ways to contribute to our church's mission, and Pushpay offers just that! Known for its user-friendly interface, Pushpay empowers you to manage your generosity directly from the convenience of your smartphone or tablet.

What does this mean for you?

Giving to Immaculate Conception and St. Patrick's is now quicker, easier, and more secure than ever before! You can access our dedicated, mobile-compatible giving page simply by scanning the QR code you see within the pews or around your church. Also, you can go to our website: icspcatholic.com and click on the Pushpay icon at the top of the page.



Through this new platform, you will be able to:

- **Make a one-time gift** with just a few taps.
- **Set up recurring gifts** to automate your regular contributions.
- **Log into your personal account** to view your complete giving history at your convenience.

This transition to Pushpay offers significant benefits for both you and our parishes. You'll have direct access to your giving records, making it easier to track your contributions. For our finance team, this modern solution will streamline our processes, allowing us to serve our parish community more efficiently.

We ask that you set up your account in Pushpay account no later than June 30th, 2025. The accounting/finance office will then ensure you are canceled in the Vanco system so there would be no duplicate deductions from your account.

Here's how to create a new account from the parish website...

1. Navigate to the icspcatholic.com giving page and complete the required fields (if you choose, "Set up recurring," there will be a few more details than shown below). Once complete, click "Next."
2. Enter your mobile number and click "Send code."
**If you do not have a mobile number, you can use a landline number and receive your security code via voice call instead. To receive your code via a voice call:*
 - a. Input your landline number and click "Need help?" located below the field for your number.
 - b. A pop-up window will appear. Click "Send code via voice call."
 - c. You will be redirected to the "Verify Your Mobile Number" screen, where you will then click "Send code."
 - d. You will receive a phone call with your code.
1. Enter the security code sent to your phone and click "Confirm."
2. Complete the form and click "Next."
3. Fill in your payment details and click "Next."
4. Choose the payment method and click "Give \$____."
5. A confirmation screen will appear, and you will receive an email to complete your account creation.

The rectory, the residence for the priest who serves our ICSP Catholic Communities, plays a vital role in supporting their ministry. It's a place where they can rest, prepare for their pastoral duties, and extend hospitality. Understanding this, the parish leadership recognized the need to update and enhance the existing rectory to better serve the needs of our current and future priests.

While specific details of the remodel plans haven't been widely publicized, the initiative speaks volumes about ICSP Catholic Communities commitment to their spiritual leaders. This remodel has updated and expanded the living space as well as making it more energy efficient.



MISSION ACCOMPLISHED: HEATING & AC PROJECT COMPLETED

The final phase of our multi-year heating and AC replacement project, which began in 2022, reached completion on April 28th, 2025. This last stage involved successfully replacing the rooftop units serving the ICSP church office and sanctuary, as well as the kitchen's AC unit. We extend our *sincere gratitude* to Anderson Heating and LaVenture Crane and Rigging for their excellent work throughout this project. Looking ahead, our next undertaking, scheduled to begin in June, is the replacement of the roof membrane and rock on the sanctuary.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

HEARD IT IN THE PEWS

From the previous newsletter, I mentioned that the Evangelization Steering Committee will be meeting with the various ministries within our parishes. We are getting closer to achieving that goal. We have identified each of the ministries in the parishes and which of the five groups they fit best into: Catechesis and Formation, Communications, Community, Resource Stewardship or Spirituality.

Bishop Powers published a Pastoral letter in 2023, **As the Father Has Sent Me, So I Send You**. There are still a few copies at the information center at Immaculate Conception and at the information rack at St. Patrick's if you would like one.

Bishop Powers recently published **Maintenance to Mission Pastoral Plan**. This is a follow up to the previous letter and two-year plan study. It is currently on the icspcatholic.com and we will get copies into the churches for you to take home.

In the letter he stated that each parish must form a Parish Evangelization Team (PET) to address evangelization. We are ahead of the curve! Our team is formed and active! Within the PET teams he asks four questions:

Where are we now? Where do we need to go? How do we get there? How will we know if we are succeeding?

These are the questions our group liaisons will be bringing to the ministries to discuss. There will be some interesting discussions. The letter also addresses the concern many have had regarding re-clustering and the closing of parishes. I encourage you to get a copy or read it on the website.

I want to share a couple stories of how evangelization is happening in our churches. Many times we think children are not paying attention or learning anything. These stories tell otherwise.

Tim teaches third grade Catholic Formation at our parish. As a project the class decided to create their own church, how to structure it, name it, how it works. One the kids in the class asked if the word church would have a small "c" or a capital "C". A girl spoke up, she answered, if we are talking about the building it is a small "c", if we are talking about the people, it is a capital "C". Profound! They get it!

A couple came asking to get married in the church this year. The future bride said she wanted to get married back in the church that helped her grow in her faith.

Ask any Catholic Formation teacher and they will question if they are making a difference. You may not see the difference you make today, tomorrow or even in the time you are teaching. Know you are making a difference in the lives of these young people, helping them grow in their faith, until it blooms at the right time in their life. You are evangelizing the youth of our parishes.

Our vision is Grow in our Faith and Lead others to Christ. Simple yet profound, let us do this together.




St. Patrick's is excited to announce that the Capital Campaign Building Project has scheduled their Groundbreaking Ceremony!


